

## HOW TO SET UP A ROUND ROBIN MATCH SCHEDULE

A round robin format is one of the best choices for developing the league schedule. The round robin format will place each team in a match against all of the other competing teams. This allows for an increased social interaction among teams as well as providing a fair and equitable way for determining winners and runners-up at the conclusion of the season.

## Match Scheduling for an Even Number of Teams

All leagues work best when there is an even number of teams playing. Provided below is an example of how to establish a round robin match schedule for six teams.

When scheduling match rotations from week to week, simply keep the No. 1 team in the same position (as in Week 1), and r otate the other team numbers in a counter-clockwise position as shown in Week 2, W eek 3 and so on. T his method will work for any even number of teams.

Week 1	Week 2	Week 3	Week 4	Week 5
1 v 2	1 v 4	1 v 6	1 v 5	1 v 3
3 v 4	2 v 6	4 v 5	6 v 3	5 v 2
5 v 6	3 v 5	2 v 3	4 v 2	6 v 4

## Match Scheduling for an Odd Number of Teams

If you have an odd number of teams, simply include a "bye" into the schedule and continue with the same method of scheduling as described above. Here's an example:

Week 1	Week 2	Week 3	Week 4	Week 5	Week 6
1 v 2	1 v 4	1 v 6	1 v bye	1 v 7	1 v 5
3 v 4	2 v 6	4 v bye	6 v 7	5 v bye	3 v 7
5 v 6	3 v bye	2 v 7	4 v 5	3 v 6	2 v bye
7 v bye	5 v 7	3 v 5	2 v 3	2 v 4	4 v 6
